# What happened in 1776?


In June 1776 Thomas Jefferson wrote this Declaration. The final version was signed on July, 4th 1776.

IN CONGRESS. JULY 4, 1776.

# The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America.

When in the course of human events, it becomes necessary for a people to break their political bonds, which have connected them with another, and to  
form among themselves a new nation, it is their right to do so, and their duty, as a self-governing people, to do it. We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal; that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights; that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. That to secure these rights, governments are instituted among men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed. That whenever any form of government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the right of the people to alter or to abolish it, and to institute a new government, laying its foundation on such principles, and organizing its power in such form, as to them shall seem best calculated to insure its safety and happiness. Therefore, we, the people of the United States, in order to form a more perfect Union, establish justice, insure domestic tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general welfare, and secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.
