Recap !



- Hawaii has been an American State since 1959...
- ...but for 175 years, the Hawaiian flag has shown the Union Jack on it. It has stayed that way since its adoption.
- On the State Seal, a Hawaiian figure (Kamehameha I) and an American symbol (Liberty) were chosen in 1845 to represent the Union between the islands and the rest of the USA.
- For many years, Hawaii has been famous for its 'Aloha Spirit', which suggests the people of Hawaii are united and welcoming.

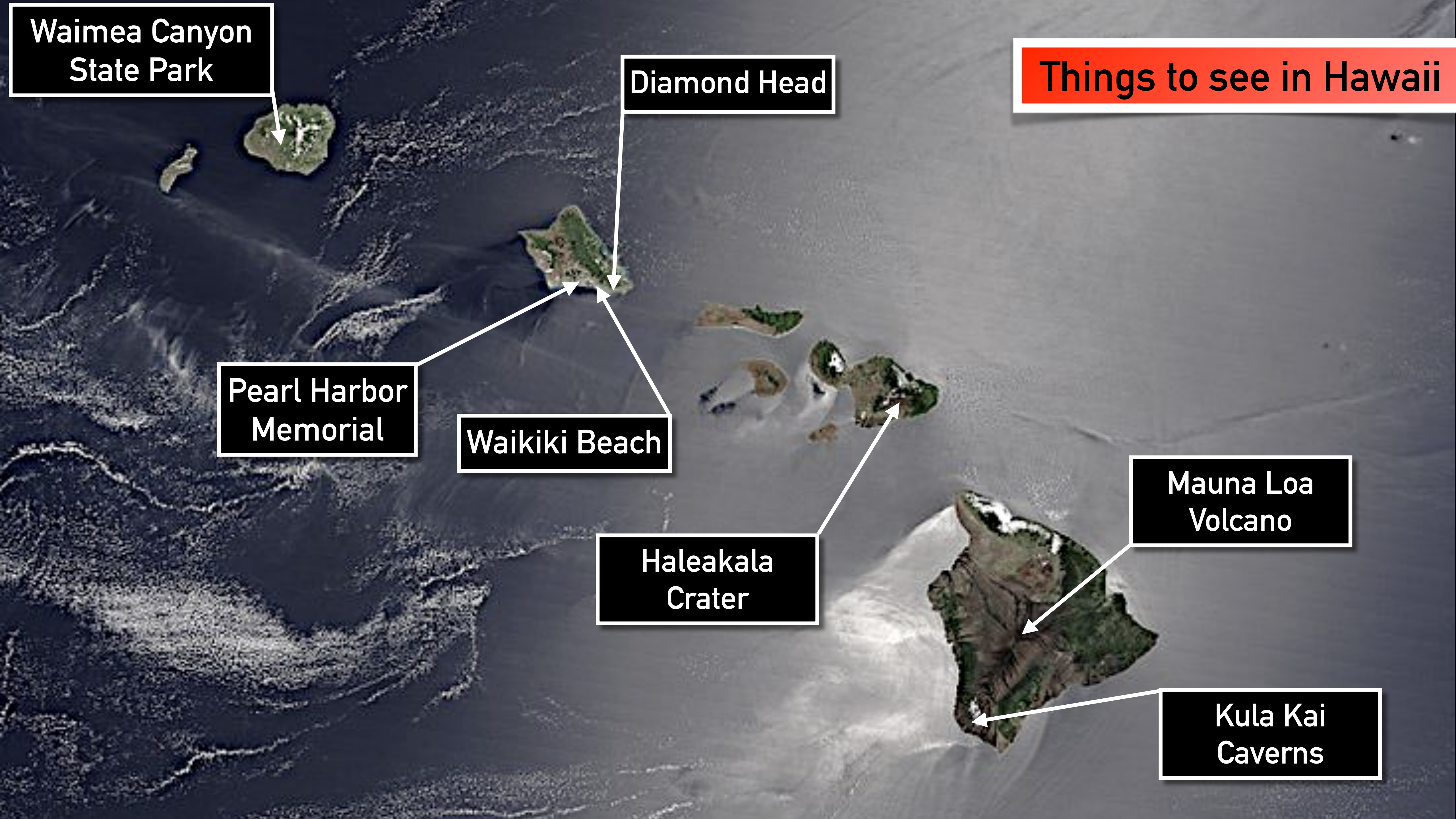
